MEMORANDUM FOR All Military Personnel, Department of Army Civilian Employees, Contractors, and Other Personnel Within the US Army Garrison, Hawaii

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum USAG-HI-60, Ammunition Amnesty Program

1. References.

- a. DA PAM 710-2-1, Using Unit Supply System (Manual Procedures), 31 Dec 97.
- b. IMCOM Reg 5-13, Installation Ammunition Support, paragraph 12, Feb 08.

2. Purpose. The US Army Ammunition Amnesty Program is intended to ensure maximum recovery of military ammunition items outside the supply system. (Commercial ammunition is handled by the local authorities.) It is not intended to circumvent normal turn-in procedures. The amnesty program provides an opportunity for individuals to return ammunition found, stolen, or misplaced without fear of prosecution. Therefore, amnesty turn-ins will not be the basis for initiation of an investigation or prosecution and are exempt from AR 190 series investigation requirements. On the other hand, the program does not relieve commanders of the obligation to turn-in unused training ammunition and residue on completion of training. The amnesty program will not be used to avoid following normal turn-in procedures.

3. Policy.

- a. Small arms ammunition (SAA) up through .50 cal found on the installation may be delivered to the Wheeler Ammunition Supply Point (WASP) at any time day or night, seven days a week. Under the Ammunition Amnesty Program, no paperwork is required to turn-in any ammunition. During normal duty hours of 0700 to 1600, ammunition can be brought to Building 1551 located on Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii. During non-duty hours (1600-0700), SAA may be placed in the amnesty box outside building 1551.

- b. Persons finding other than - SAA, are directed to:

- (1) Not touch or move the ammunition, even if the markings indicate the ammunition is harmless.

- (2) Mark the location of the ammunition.

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(3) Report to the Military Police (MP).

(4) Provide description of ammunition item to the MP.

(5) Prohibit others from entering the area.

(6) Explosive items found outside a military installation must be reported to local authorities, or MP.

4. Ammunition Found on Installation (FOI).

a. All FOI ammunition will be considered hazardous. Guidelines posted in 3a will be used for SAA and 3b for all other ammunition. Directly notify the Range Control or the MPs to evaluate the ammunition and contact EOD as required. In the event those personnel are unable to respond, call the telephone number in the last paragraph.

b. After evaluation, EOD will dispose of FOI as required or clear it to be moved to the ASP.

5. Ammunition Found Off Installation.

a. Extreme care must be taken when receiving ammunition from off installation sources. Old war trophies and souvenirs can be extremely unstable. If there is any question as to the safety or stability of any item being turned in, do the following:

b. Carefully secure and isolate the item.

c. Immediately contact the MP and request they contact the EOD personnel.

d. Await the arrival of EOD.

e. If determined to be unsafe, EOD will dispose of the ammunition or explosive immediately.

f. Once EOD has cleared the ammunition, it can be transported to the ASP.

6. Amnesty Day. An installation amnesty day will be scheduled annually to assist in the collection of abandoned or unauthorized ammunition. The amnesty day will receive wide spread publicity on the installation and in the surrounding civilian communities.


