MEMORANDUM FOR All Active Military Units, Directorates, Contractors, and Tenant Activities on United States Army Garrison, Hawaii (USAG-HI) Installations.

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum USAG-HI-55, Electrical Generator Control Policy

1. References.

a. Army Regulation 200-1, Environmental Protection and Enhancement, Para 4-1, December 13, 2007.

b. Clean Air Act of 1970 and Amendments.

c. Environmental Protection Agency, Mandatory Greenhouse Gas Reporting Rule (GHG MRR), 74 Federal Register 56260, 30 Oct 09.

d. Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), Title 11, Chapter 60.1.

2. Purpose. To provide a generator policy to ensure that generators on USAG-HI are tracked by the Directorate of Public Works (DPW), Environmental Division, in order to comply with all federal, state, and Army regulations.

3. Applicability. This policy memorandum applies to all active military units, Directorates, contractors, and tenant activities that purchase, install, operate, or maintain generators on USAG-HI installations.

4. This policy memorandum requires the use of the *Generator Inventory Sheet* (enclosure 1).

5. The *Generator Fact Sheet* (enclosure 2) provides a summary of generator information related to this policy, and can also be found on the Garrison's Sustainability and Environmental Management website at <http://www.garrison.hawaii.army.mil/sustainability/AtoZ.aspx>.

6. Command Policy.

a. Generators. Generators must be tracked by the DPW, Environmental Division to be included on the USAG-HI air emissions inventory. Failure to track these emissions can result in fines up to \$25,000 per day.

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum USAG-HI-55, Generator Control Policy

b. It shall be the responsibility of all active military units, Directorates, contractors, and tenant activities to:

(1) List all generators on the *Generator Inventory Sheet* prescribed by this policy memorandum and provide one copy to the DPW Environmental Division. The inventory shall be updated annually and submitted to the DPW, Environmental Division not later than February 1 of each calendar year.

(2) Contact DPW, Environmental Division during project planning, prior to the purchase of any generator. In accordance with the HAR and the State of Hawaii, Department of Health Clean Air Branch, an evaluation for permitting purposes will need to be made by DPW, Environmental Division to avoid delays in generator use or operation.

7. This policy supersedes Polich Memorandum USAG-HI-55, SAB, dated 28 Oct 11 and shall remain in effect until cancelled or superseded in writing.

8. Proponent. The USAG-HI DPW, Environmental Division is the proponent for this policy memorandum. For additional information on this policy or assistance with any air related matters please contact the DPW Clean Air Act program staff at (808) 656-3104 or (808) 656-2878.
