CHECK POINT ** Kapakahi Stream across the HPD
Training Academy

- **WHAT:** City and County of Honolulu "Mauka to Makai" Celebration Pearl City Bike Path Clean-Up
- **WHERE:** Area between Makalena Golf Course (Kapakahi stream) and Waipahu High School, approximately 1.2 miles. (See map following). Marsh across the Recycling Collection, Waipahu Depot Road.
- *****Check-point for 9th MSC /TSG participants is on Waipahu Depot Road, in front of HPD Academy.**
- **WHEN:** Saturday April 21, 2012. Check in at 8:00 a.m. Clean-Up is from 8:30 a.m. to approximately 11:00 a.m.
- **PARKING:** HPD Academy parking lot on Waipahu Depot Road or dirt area in front of the academy.
- **ATTIRE:** Covered shoes, comfortable PT-type clothing, sunscreen, and hat. Bottled water will be provided but we suggest to bring a bottle.

ADOPT-A-STREAM PROGRAM
SAFETY RULES AND GUIDELINES FOR VOLUNTEERS

All Volunteers Must:

- wear the provided orange safety vest
- park all vehicles clear of the roadway and on the same side of the road where volunteers are working
- be 12 years of age to participate in a cleanup
- furnish adequate supervision by one or more adults 21 years of age or older for groups that have participants 10-17 years of age
- complete clean-ups only during daylight hours
- obey all safety rules and guidelines
- conduct a safety meeting for all participants prior to each cleanup and go over Safety Rules and Guidelines for Volunteers and Safety Procedures for stream cleanups

For Your Safety:

- wear light-colored clothing that covers arms and legs
- wear plastic coated gloves provided by your Adopt-A-Stream Coordinator
- wear clothing that will not impair vision or movement during cleanup activities
- work in small groups
- stay well clear of any construction
- stop work in inclement weather
- postpone clean-ups until 72 hours after any storm event
- during warm weather months, drink plenty of fluids – take breaks – avoid overexertion
- be alert for stinging insects and poisonous plants
- do not remove hazardous substances or dead animals (notify your local Adopt-A-Stream Coordinator and provide location of the item)
- avoid contact with noxious weeds and areas where herbicides were applied
- carpool to the site to reduce number of vehicles
- use proper lifting and bending techniques

- Print out the required paperwork. Have each participant complete and sign the forms and email the completed paperwork to Marybeth.S.Racette.ctr@mail.mil or Maria.C.Vicari.ctr@mail.mil
- Or fax forms to: (808)438-4933
Attn: Environmental Division
- Or bring the required paperwork to the walk and turn into the group leader.
- Each child under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an Adult (1:2 ratio is required for safety reasons however 1:1 is recommended).

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DAY OF THE EVENT

Check in with the Team Leader **by** 8:00 a.m. 9th MSC/TSG will break into two groups if the number of participants is large enough. One group will start off on the bike path clean-up along Kapakahi Stream. The second group will be assigned to help on the revegetation on the toe slope of Kapakahi Stream.

For those on the bike path clean-up crew, once you've reached the Waipio Point Access Road behind Waipahu High School, you've completed the route and can turn around. This should take no longer than 1½ hours.

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USEFUL INFORMATION

- Trash bags and gloves will be provided by City and County of Honolulu. Team Leaders will distribute items once you've checked in.
- A tin can will also be provided in the event you find sharp objects; i.e. needles or blades. The person holding the can is required to be over the age of 18.
- H2O and fruits have been donated and will be available for all participants at each check point and along the bike path. However, it's a good idea to bring a bottle of water to start with. your 9th MSC/TSG Team Leader will have more information the day of the clean-up regarding the water stations.
- First-Aid stations will be set up in front of the HPD Academy.
- Honolulu Police Department will have several "ROVING" teams to help out if any problems arise. The Team Leader will have a contact number for one of the officers. If you encounter any problems or need assistance, do not hesitate to call.

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USEFUL INFORMATION



If tires, batteries or large bulky items are found, set them on the bike path and they will be picked up by another team designated for these items.



Designate a person on the team to collect only plastics, aluminum and bottles. These are items that should be separated from regular rubbish.



*****Bring a walking stick if you have one. It can help move away brush/foilage when picking up items.**
