ABOUT U.S. ARMY GARRISON-HAWAII

Hawaii has been an important strategic location for the U.S. military for more than 100 years, and that importance continues today. As part of the Army's Installation Management Command, U.S. Army Garrison-Hawaii (USAG-HI) is one of numerous Army garrisons worldwide dedicated to providing Soldiers, civilians and families with a quality of life commensurate with their level of service and sacrifice to the Nation.

Delivering Quality Services

Army installations offer many of the same services provided in the civilian community, such as police, fire, housing and child care. In Hawaii, USAG-HI is responsible for the day-to-day operations and services offered at 22 Army installations and sub-installations on the islands of Oahu and Hawaii. From engineers to counselors to security specialists, these services are supported by a diverse and dedicated workforce comprised of more than 820 civilian employees.

Ensuring Soldiers are Trained & Ready

Approximately 24,000 Soldiers live and work in Hawaii. The garrison plays a critical role ensuring Soldiers are trained and ready to answer the nation's call. USAG-HI has six major training areas between Oahu and Hawaii Island, supporting the needs of service members from the Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, Hawaii Army National Guard, Hawaii Air National Guard, and Reserves.

Whether assisting Soldiers with transition paperwork, providing them a safe and secure environment to work in, or offering state-of-the-art digital training equipment and facilities, USAG-HI works to enable a self-reliant and globally responsive all volunteer Army.

Serving Soldiers & Families

The Army's strength comes from its Soldiers, civilians and families. USAG-HI builds the health, morale and well-being of the force through more than 100 programs and services. For example, the garrison's Warrior Adventure Quest program uses high-adventure activities in a controlled setting to help returning Soldiers adjust to the pace of life outside of a combat zone.

Also, USAG-HI's first-of-its-kind Blue Star Card program recognizes the sacrifices of the families of deployed Soldiers through special activities and benefits. These programs, together with overarching initiatives like the Comprehensive Soldier and Family Fitness program, build resilience and support the strength of the Army family.

Contributing to Our Communities

The Army takes an active role in the local community through the Partnership of Ohana community relations program. Soldiers support local events and service projects such as parades, ceremonies and beach cleanups, and participate at nine monthly neighborhood boards across Oahu. Army units also currently partner with 44 public schools on Oahu and 8 schools on Hawaii Island through the School Partnership Program. This joint program has been creating bonds between Hawaii's public schools and Army units since the mid-1980s.

Practicing Responsible Stewardship

At USAG-HI, we strive to manage the resources entrusted to us—our funding, natural and cultural resources, energy, infrastructure, workforce and systems—in a sustainable manner. On the environmental front, our award-winning natural and cultural resources programs are the largest in the Army, protecting more than 100 threatened and endangered species, and managing more than 1,900 archaeological sites and historic structures on Oahu and Hawaii Island.
