SUBJECT: U.S. Army Hawaii Policy Letter #19 – Authorization to Roll Sleeves on the Army Combat Uniform (ACU)

1. References.

- a. Army Regulation (AR) 670-1, Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia, 10 April 2015.
- b. Department of the Army pamphlet (DA PAM) 670-1, Guide to the Wear and Appearance of Army Uniforms and Insignia, 1 July 2015.
- c. Memorandum, Department of the Army, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-1, 29 June 2016, subject: Authorization to Roll Sleeves on the Army Combat Uniform (ACU).

2. Purpose. To outline the policy for rolling sleeves year-round while wearing the universal camouflage pattern (UCP) ACU, operational camouflage pattern (OCP) ACU, and Operation Enduring Freedom camouflage pattern (OEF-CP) ACU. Wear and appearance of all other uniforms remains in accordance with standards outlined in AR 670-1 and DA PAM 670-1.

3. Applicability. This policy applies to all Soldiers assigned to the 25th Infantry Division. O6 commanders and above of other U.S. Army Hawaii (USARHAW) units may authorize exceptions to this policy as required.

4. Soldiers will roll sleeves when in a garrison environment in accordance with the following:

- a. The camouflage pattern will remain exposed at the cuff.
- b. Personnel will roll sleeves neatly above the elbow but not more than 3 inches above the elbow.

5. Soldiers will not roll their sleeves (sleeves must be down) during the following conditions:

- a. While conducting range operations.

- b. While conducting field exercises.
 - c. While wearing tactical gear.
 - e. Motorcyclists must cover their arms while riding, by either rolling sleeves down or wearing an approved jacket.
 - f. When operating or riding as a passenger in a military tactical vehicle.
 - g. When riding as a passenger in a military aircraft.
 - h. During formal events, such as Flying "V", Change of Command, or Change of Responsibility ceremonies.
 - i. Any other time the commander determines sleeves must be down for operational or safety reasons.
6. Male and female Soldiers who are unable to roll their sleeves due to the size of the cuff on the OCP top are authorized to wear sleeves down at all times with commander approval.
7. Upon approval of the commander, and only during field training exercises, sleeves may be cuffed inside the coat one roll.
8. All Soldiers standing in formation must have sleeves rolled or sleeves down. Mixing of rolled sleeves and unrolled sleeves is not authorized.
9. This memorandum supersedes USARHAW Policy Letter #14, dated 22 July 2016 and remains in effect until superseded or rescinded in writing.
