MEMORANDUM FOR All Military Personnel and Department of Defense Civilian Employees within United States Army Garrison, Hawaii (USAG-HI) Installations

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum USAG-HI-21, Army Installation Microchip Program

1. References.

- a. AR 40-905, Veterinary Health Services, 29 Aug 06.
- b. Chapter 4-29, Hawaii Administrative Rules, Animal Quarantine Laws.
- c. Hawaii Revised Statutes §143-4, Issuance of License and Tags.

2. Applicability. This policy applies to all Soldiers, Civilians, Family members, contractors, and other personnel who work on, reside on, or visit any US Army installations, facilities, or work sites in Hawaii.

3. Policy.

a. All cats and dogs kept on Army installations on Oahu are required to have a working identification microchip implanted under its skin. A microchip is a small device that provides an identification number used to locate the registered address and owner should a pet become lost or abandoned on a USAG-HI installation.

b. As required by the State of Hawaii, cats and dogs processed through the Hawaii Quarantine Facility for the shortened animal quarantine time must have a working microchip implanted prior to arriving in Hawaii. In addition, the City and County of Honolulu requires all dogs, four months or older, to wear a county-issued license tag.

c. Within 14 days of arriving on any USAG-HI installation, all privately owned dogs and cats must have a microchip and be registered with the applicable Veterinary Treatment Facility (VTF) at Schofield Barracks or Fort Shafter.

d. If a pet does not have a microchip, the VTF must inform the client of the microchip policy and deny treatment until properly microchipped.

e. Upon notification by the VTF, the pet owner has 90 days to comply with the installation policy. If corrective action is not taken by the pet owner, the USAG-HI Commander will take appropriate administrative action, which may result in termination



of pet privileges. Furthermore, the Service Member may be subject to punishment under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

f. The VTF is located at Building 936, Duck Road, Schofield Barracks and at Building 435, Pierce Road, Fort Shafter.

4. This policy memorandum supersedes policy memorandum USAG-HI-35, SAB, dated 19 May 14, and remains in effect until rescinded or superseded in writing.
