SUBJECT: 26 March 2015 Comprehensive Training Programmatic Agreement (PA) Consultation Kickoff Meeting Notes.

1. On Thursday, 26 March 2015, the United States Army Garrison - Pōhakuloa (USAG-P) held an introductory meeting to initiate consultation on the development of a comprehensive Programmatic Agreement (PA) for multiple undertakings associated with training activities at Army lands and facilities. The meeting was held in the USAG-P Headquarters Conference Room from 1800 to 2000. A total of fifteen people attended the meeting. Attendees included representatives of USAG-P, USAG-Hawaii, US Army Pacific Mission Support Element (USARPAC MSE), Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Installation Management (OACSIM), Installation Management Command Headquarters (IMCOM HQ), the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP), the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA), the USAG-P Cultural Advisory Committee (CAC) and Dawson Technical. A complete list of attendees is included below.

2. Dr. Taomia opened the meeting at 1800 followed by a brief greeting by Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) Sanderson and a *pule* (prayer) by Mr. Elarionoff.

3. The meeting notes are as follows:

a. Dr. Taomia introduced and presented USAG-HI's intention of developing a comprehensive training PA. Following Dr. Taomia's presentation, LTC Sanderson asked for feedback regarding the PA proposal.

b. Mr. Shane Nelson advocated for separate PAs for Hawai'i Island and O'ahu.

c. Ms. Katharine Kerr noted that there would likely be parts of the documents that would be developed together and then split off to tailor to the specific needs of Hawai'i and O'ahu Islands.

d. Mr. Elarionoff noted that there are different values on the different islands, and that it is important to keep them separate.

e. Mr. Nelson asked about properties at Pōhakuloa Training Area (PTA) that have achieved significance within the last 50 years, and used as an example the *ahu* at Pu'u Huluhulu near the Mauna Kea access road intersection with Saddle Road. Dr. Taomia answered that she is not aware of any, although there are shrines on PTA. But these are older sites.

f. Mr. Killian noted that if there are some areas that are more sensitive than others those can be broken out, that feedback about sensitivity is good.

g. There was discussion of Kawaihae Harbor. Mr. Elarionoff noted the fishing seasons at Kawaihae harbor, and that congestion with boats in the harbor can impact the fishing.

h. There was discussion about how a PA is structured, whether there are both statements of what will be done and what will not be done. Is there punishment for doing something you're not supposed to?

i. Mr. Moore brought up the possibility of developing an interim PA to cover easy or non-controversial actions that would be in place until the full PA is completed. Then they would be incorporated into the comprehensive training PA.

4. Notes from the board included the following:

- a. Should we look at these easy items through the 106 process? (used example of Makua PA expiration)
- b. Like the idea of keeping PAs separate for both islands. Really advocate this.
- c. Does a person's dissent have to be based on law?
- d. Hard to travel, sometimes difficult by phone to participate.
- e. Hawaiian community has different values. Often don't share what they really think. Sometimes we're in conflict.
- f. Different locations and times are recommended.
- g. Be considerate of state holidays.
- h. Question regarding Stryker Brigade descriptions of activities – will some things just be written as one general sentence?
- i. If something isn't descriptive enough can we make it more descriptive?
- j. Was there anything at (or near) PTA that recently qualified for registration on the national Register of Historic Places? (less than 50 years old)
- k. Why include Kawaihae?
- l. Likes looking at impacts from "big picture" (training, land management, etc.)
- m. Will PA say what you're NOT going to do? (comparison to law enforcement – if law says not to do something there's punishment)

- n. Can you do an overriding PA for actions that are simple or really have no effect?
This could be implemented temporarily until the PA is finalized. These actions could be integrated back into the final PA.

5. Mr. Elarionoff offered a closing *pule* and the meeting concluded at 2000.
