

RESPIRE CARE ELIGIBILITY CHANGE

1- Overview

A. Purpose: To provide information to installation leadership on the restructuring of the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) Respite Care program

B. Task: Notify EFMP Families receiving respite care on the restructure of respite levels of care, and the elimination of respite care for Levels 1 and 2, per the directive of Installation Management Command (IMCOM)

2- Background

A. Since, 2007, the Army has been providing in-home EFMP respite care through a centralized contract. The program currently provides up to 40 hours per month of in-home respite care to 607 Families Army-wide

B. Due to recent fiscal constraints, IMCOM has made a decision to restructure the EFMP Respite Care Program

3- Concept

Respite care services will continue for new applicants who meet the criteria and those currently enrolled until July 2017

A. July 2017, respite care for levels 1 and 2 will be discontinued:
Level 1: Supervision with daily living skills, safety of EFM
Level 2: Supervision with specialized training, managing difficult behavior

B. July 2017, respite care for Level 3 and 4 will be reduced to 25 hours per month for those Families that meet the eligibility requirement:
Level 3: Supervision with technical knowledge and skills to assist EFMs, provide one-on-one special assistance
Level 4: Provide one-on-one care to EFMs who have life threatening or chronic conditions

4- Way Ahead

- A. Communications Plan Outline:
1. Send initial letter signed by Garrison Commander to Families by 30 September 2016
 2. System Navigator will contact Families quarterly; remind Families of pending respite care changes
 3. Send second Garrison Commander letter 60 days prior to July 2017
- B. Recommended additional communication venues: List respite care changes on Garrison/DFMWR website
- C. EFMP staff will provide information on local and state resources that offer respite care support



Two Phase Military Construction Program

- Phase 1: Construct 429 stall parking garage
- Phase 1a: Construct 80,000 square foot Behavioral Health and Dental Clinic Annex
- Phase 2: Construct 771 stall parking garage and Alterations to Existing Clinic Facilities




Phase 1: Construct 429 stall (160K SF) parking garage - \$30M
Phase 1a: Construct 80K SF Behavioral Health/Dental Clinic Annex - Award in 2016 and complete by 2018.






Top View Phase 1 Parking Garage





Phase 2: Construct 771 stall (321K SF) parking garage and 126K SF in clinic alterations. Award in 2018 and complete in 2021.





Phase 1 Parking Structure Timeline

- Begin construction of parking garage: 01 Nov 2016
- Complete construction: 31 Jan 2018

During construction there will be a SEVERE shortage of parking in the immediate and surrounding area of the SB Health Clinic.

This will significantly impact the Patients, Military personnel, and Civilian employees of the Health Clinic as well as the Community at large.




Mitigation Plan

- A satellite parking lot is being constructed and established as part of this project to address the parking shortfalls.
- A one for one replacement of parking stalls is being established at the satellite location.
- Employees of the clinic, both military and civilian will be asked to use the satellite parking area to reserve the balance of stalls for patients of the clinic.
- A shuttle bus service has also been established as part of the project to allow staff to be transported to and from their place of duty.
- We are trying to reserve as many parking stalls for patients and families as possible.




**New Parking Structure



Military Maintenance Team (MMT)

Trained Soldiers

Support from Within



MMT Trained Soldiers Support from Within

Military Maintenance Team (MMTs) :

- Soldiers trained by DPW and provided materials to perform minor maintenance and repair in their footprint
- Barracks, COFs, BOFs, motor pools, hangars, etc.

Purpose of MMT Program

- Soldiers do the most minor maintenance and repair
- Enables DPW to respond quicker to more difficult repairs
- Goal for MMTs to provide “first line” repairs for their facilities

What MMTs Can Do for Unit

- Correct minor problems quickly
- Repair abuse in barracks
- Provide Command visibility of facility maintenance in their AOR
- Occasional larger projects to improve appearance (see pictures)



MMT Trained Soldiers Support from Within

MMT Program exists, but is not functioning well

Process doesn't integrate MMT assets with unit

- Major plumbing problem on 21 Sept 16 in Bldg 2083
- Staff duty didn't know who to call for MMT assistance
- Results was that a 5th floor problem caused damage on lower 4 floors
- Clean up efforts extensive

Lack of coordination of MMT assets

- MMT at Company level not coordinated with MMT assets at Bn, Bde level
- MMT not coordinated with BMRs in the barracks
- Continuity of MMT assets; assigning short-term personnel

DPW called to make minor repairs that MMTs could/should do



MMT Trained Soldiers Support from Within

Suggested Improvements to MMT Program

- Units take “ownership” of their assigned spaces
- Commands understand importance of MMT program
- Establish MMT hierarchy from Bde to Bn to Company level
- Establish process where MMT gets first call about minor maintenance issue
- Coordinate MMT assets with Barracks Management Reps



MMT Trained Soldiers Support from Within

MMT soldiers are trained to repair :

A. Carpentry

1. Repair Walls – gypboard, hollow tile, wood
2. Repair Doors – replace or tighten hinges, handles, plates, glass
3. Repair windows – replace or tighten screens, hinges, fasteners, glass
4. Replace acoustical drop ceiling tile
5. Repair or replace T bar for drop ceiling grid
6. Install wall covering or paneling with chair rail molding
7. Replace and install base cove
8. Repair by replacement floor tile
9. Replace medicine cabinet
10. Replace toilet paper holder
11. Replace soap holder
12. Replace toothbrush holder
13. Cut duplicate keys for living quarters
14. Replace or tighten stair/treads
15. Repair, adjust or replace drapery and curtain rods and window shades
16. Install or replace weather stripping on doors and windows

B. Electrical

1. Replace fluorescent lamps
2. Replace incandescent bulbs
3. Replace cover plates for light switches and receptacles
4. Replace plug on power cords

C. Plumbing

1. Replace washers and seats in faucets, shower valves
2. Replace toilet bowl wax
3. Replace parts in flush valves for commodes and urinals
4. Replace toilet seats
5. Replace hose bibs
6. Unclog commodes, lavatories, floor drains
7. Hook up water fountains







- The Directorate of Emergency Services (DES) will provide increased security presence in the community during Trick or Treat hours. As always, the community should feel free to approach any military or DA police officer with issues/concerns.
- Military Police personnel will hand out chemical-light souvenirs to children over the course of the evening.
- Parents are strongly encouraged to have children carry a flashlight or a chemical-light.
- DES recommends that parents remind their children out trick or treating alone, to think about safety:
 - Wait for proper traffic signals and stay on the sidewalk whenever possible
 - If there is no sidewalk, walk on the left side of the roadway facing traffic
 - Look both ways before crossing the street and use crosswalks
 - Never enter vehicles or homes when invited by a stranger



Locations of Vehicles Impounded within Schofield









- **Truck Driving (must have Commercial Driver's License)**
Concrete ready mix or cement (industry desperate for drivers, drivers home most nights, good pay & benefits)

Get a Kit (Continued)

- Make sure your emergency kit also includes items specific to your special needs, for example:
 - Eyeglasses
 - Medications
 - Infant formula / diapers
 - Food and extra water for pets / service animals
- Additional Items to consider:
 - Important family documents in a waterproof container
 - Cash, change, or traveler's checks
 - Local maps



Make A Plan

- Making a plan is simple... just think of the 5 Ws!
 - Who: Gather input from all family members
 - What: Plan for all hazards that could effect your family
 - Where: Establish plans for evacuation and meeting places
 - When: Review plan annually or as major changes in your family occurs
 - Why: Having a plan will enable your family to respond to an emergency more quickly



Be Informed

- The following are the methods used to warn the community of an emergency:
 - Mass Notification System
 - Giant Voice Warning System
 - ATHOC Telephonic & Computer Pop-up Alerts
 - Island Palms Community Call Max System
 - Facebook / Twitter
 - Nixle Alert Text Messages
 - TV / Radio Broadcasts
 - Hawaii State Siren and Emergency Alert System
