Army identifies suspect, continues search

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Hawaii – Army authorities are continuing to searching for a high-risk, suspicious individual on Schofield Barracks after receiving a threat via telephone at 10:18 a.m., today.

The suspect has been identified as a black male, 5 ft., 8 in. tall and approximately 190 lbs., last seen driving a black Oldsmobile, license plate RFN839. He is wearing a blue long sleeve shirt and black jeans and has a tattoo of Texas on his right forearm. He may be armed. If seen, do not approach or interact with the individual, call 911 immediately.

Army authorities have confirmed that the threat is a domestic issue between a male suspect and his girlfriend.

Schofield Barracks is only at a heightened state of alert; and all gates are open.

Solomon Elementary School students are no longer on lock down and were dismissed as normal at 1:50 p.m. Hale Kula Elementary School is also no longer on lock down and students are currently being released.
