Schofield museum offers Living History Day, Saturday

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Hawaii (Oct. 9, 2014) –The Tropic Lightning Museum, here, will once again bring history to life at its Living History Day event Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

This free, public event commemorates the longstanding history of the 25th Infantry Division, which is celebrating its 73rd birthday this month.

Farrington High School’s JROTC will lead the opening ceremony at 10 a.m., followed by several local performers and historical demonstrations.

The 25th Infantry Division’s *Tropic Knights* Big Band will play at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. The *Hawaii Jitterbugs* Lindy Hop and Swing dancers will be dancing all day with special performances at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Throughout the day, visitors can chat with current Soldiers in combat gear, re-enactors in vintage war uniforms, and Hawaii’s historical preservation organizations. Additional highlights include an antique firearms display, K-9 working dogs demonstrations, restored military vehicles and historic memorabilia. Special activities for children, like camouflage face painting and a sidewalk chalk contest will keep the keiki entertained.

Non-military visitors should enter through Schofield’s Lyman Gate and will be asked to show identification, current car registration and proof of insurance. Children 15 and under do not have to show identification.
