Schofield museum offers Living History Day, Saturday

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Hawaii (Oct. 7, 2014) –The Tropic Lightning Museum, here, will once again bring history to life at its Living History Day event Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

This free, public event commemorates the longstanding history of the 25th Infantry Division, which is celebrating its 74th birthday this month.

Farrington High School’s JROTC will lead the opening ceremony at 10 a.m., followed by several local performers and historical demonstrations.

Throughout the day, visitors can chat with current Soldiers in combat gear, re-enactors in the vintage war uniforms, and Hawaii’s historical preservation organizations. Additional highlights include, 25th Infantry Division’s Tropic Knights Big Band, the Hawaii Jitterbugs, Celtic Kula bagpipers, antique firearms display, K-9 working dogs demonstrations, restored military vehicles and historic memorabilia. Children’s activities include camouflage face painting and games. Food will be available for purchase.

This year visitors can download a new walking tour app featuring 20 points of interest in Schofield Barracks historic district. The app is free and offers an audio guide and map. The app can be downloaded by searching for “izi.TRAVEL” in the app store. Once the app is downloaded, search for “Schofield Barracks Walking Tour.”

Non-military visitors must enter through Lyman Gate and show a valid driver’s license, proof of insurance, and safety check. All vehicle occupants 16 years of age and older must present a valid state or government photo ID and are subject to an installation security background check.
