Pōhakuloa Training Area to allow mammal bow hunting this weekend

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii—Pōhakuloa Training Area will be open to mammal bow hunting on Saturday Mar. 2 and Sunday Mar. 3.

Training Areas 1-4 and 10-11 will be open for archery mammal hunting. All hunting areas will be open from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day; no early access is permitted.

It is recommended not to harvest ewes and nannies with juveniles that have not been weaned off to ensure survivorship. No person shall remove any live game from any hunting area.

The following gate will be open to enter and exit the hunting areas: East Saddle Road--Gates 1-10. Please park in designated parking areas.

All hunters must check in and check out at either the Kilohana Hunter's Check-in Station located between Mile Markers 43 and 44 on Saddle Road; the Huluhulu Hunter's Check-in Station at the intersection of Mauna Kea Access Road and Saddle Road—near Mile Marker 28; or the Pu'u AnaHulu Check-in Station near Mile Marker 14 on Highway 190. Hunters must check out by 7:30 p.m. each day.

Hunting passes will be available at the check-in stations. Please place the pass on your vehicle dashboard when hunting. Hunting passes are only valid for Mar. 2 and Mar. 3.

The temporary hunting pass now includes a Disclaimer and Waiver of Liability statement. All hunters must read and sign the statement and place the pass on their vehicle dashboard. Hunters who do not have a hunting pass with a signed waiver statement on their dash will be barred from hunting for 30 days.

2-2-2 HUNT

Hunting is prohibited in Training Areas 5-9 and 12-23. For the safety of military personnel and themselves, hunters should not enter these areas.

PTA is extremely dry and fires can start easily. No smoking or open flames are allowed in all training and hunting areas. Please report all fires to the PTA Federal Fire Department at 969-2447 or 969-2448.

No firearms, alcoholic beverages, all-terrain vehicles, dirt bikes or recreational vehicles are allowed in the training and hunting areas. Please close all gates when entering or leaving hunting areas.
